Attendance – High focus on changing attendance level of low attenders (less than 90%)


Achievement- Improving the performance of our best maths students. (Increase the number of A's and B's) through active participation and quality instruction.

Starting School Again

Starting school involves a big change for your child and family after holidays. For some children and families it is the first time at school, changes to teachers, classrooms and student groups or beginning at a new school. It can be a time of great excitement and interest, but also a time of potential challenge, stress and tiredness. Families play an important role in supporting children to positively and successfully manage this transition and their emotions.

You may find your child is excited but they may also be exhausted and tired, even if they are used to long hours at their pre-school or early childhood education and care setting(ECEC) or before and after care centre setting. Take the time to notice their mood, and think about how you will support your child to manage these feelings and reduce their stress or anxiety. Every family's strategies are different, so it can be helpful to reflect on what has helped your child manage and adapt to change in the past.

Consider what sorts of strategies you might implement to help your child:

- For some children, minimising after school activities or waiting until your child is settled into school before introducing new activities is helpful. The school day can be quite long for your child and they may not have the energy to engage in other activities. They can begin after school activities once they have adjusted into the routine.
- Plan some relaxing time after school. Depending on your child's interests, this may consist of quiet play
- or jumping on the trampoline. Follow your child's lead on what works best for them.
- Help your child to get a good night's sleep. Having a regular routine such as taking a bath before bedtime or reading in bed is helpful to induce a restful sleep. Avoiding screen time an hour before bed is also a must.
- Positive talk about school and what happens is also vital. Ask in the afternoons key questions like:- What were 3 things that you enjoyed doing today? Who were the 3 friends you played with? What were things you learnt about today? Focus on the positive mind set about school to build resilience with change. may help your child to relax.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The Annual General Meeting (AGM) for 2018 will be held on February 20th at 6pm in the resource centre.

President

The President chairs all general and executive committee meetings. The role of the President includes providing leadership, acting as a spokesperson, reporting to P&C meetings about the activities of the P&C, exercising some supervision of the functions of others, ensuring good communication exists between the P&C and the school and encouraging parents to participate.

Vice President

The Vice President role includes presiding as chair at meetings where the President is absent, being familiar with the operation of the P&C, becoming acquainted with the duties of President, having an understanding of meeting rules and procedure and undertaking tasks to reduce the burden of the President.

Secretary

The Secretary role includes preparing and circulating P&C meeting agendas and minutes, scribing minutes during P&C meetings, maintain contact lists for P&C position holders, maintain an actions list from meetings, submit a fortnightly write-up of P&C notices to be included in the school newsletter.

Treasurer

The position of Treasurer entails receipt and care of all P&C monies, payment of authorised bills from P&C funds, bookkeeping of P&C accounts, reporting to P&C members on a regular basis, the receipts and payments handled, preparing a

Financial Statement of Income and Expenditure and a Balance Sheet for the audit of the P&C books.
